Breast, Cervical and Colon Health Program (BCCHP-PHSW)

The Breast, Cervical and Colon Health Program (BCCHP) provides breast, cervical, and colon screening to eligible women and men. The Best Protection is early detection. The program provides free breast exams, cervical, pap smear test, and colon screenings to eligible people. The program serves people who:

- Don't have insurance
- Don't qualify for Apple Health
- Have a lower income
- Meet the age guidelines
- Have a high deductible for follow-up cancer testing
- Live in Skamania, Clark, Cowlitz, Wahkiakum, Lewis, Pacific, Thurston, Grays Harbor, and Mason Counties
